Pre-AP English 10 – Mrs. Bennett Course Syllabus

This course is a comprehensive study of English grammar, literature, and writing. The course enforces the use of communication skills, literary analysis, and research skills—all of which are needed in business and college writing. Additionally, this course is designed for students needing a challenge. Expectations are high for academic performance and behavior.

Classroom Guidelines and Expectations

- 1. **Be here.** You should be in your assigned seat when the bell rings or you will be counted tardy. Further, we will read and discuss for the entire period, so do not pack up early.
- 2. Be responsible. Bring materials to class daily including your English binder, paper, a pen, and work that is due. All assignments and projects are collected at the beginning of class on the due date or it is considered late. Late homework will not receive credit. Major projects, such as essays and speeches, may be accepted for half-credit within 24 hours of the due date. After that, no credit will be given. You are responsible for getting any missed notes or assignments from the absent folder or a classmate that were given during an absence. It is also imperative that you schedule make-up tests or quizzes with me in a timely fashion.
- 3. Be respectful. You are expected to be courteous and respectful to all students, teachers, and guests. There will be no swearing, name-calling, snide comments, or sleeping. In addition, take care of our classroom by picking up after yourself and avoiding bringing food or drinks to class. Use of cell phones or other electronic devices are prohibited per school policy and will be confiscated and turned into the office.
- 4. Be engaged. Participation is necessary for learning to take place. I want to hear your thoughts and opinions. The more you are willing to question while you read and discuss, the more fun we will have this year.
